Our History

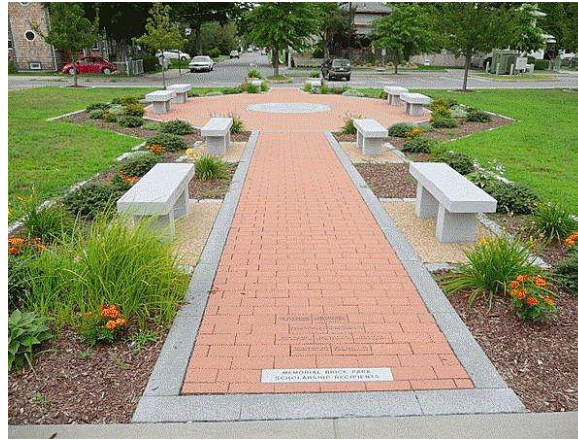
The concept of the FHS Memorial Brick Park, located behind The High School between the old Gymnasium and Larch Avenue, is credited to Debra St. Pierre who wanted to raise funds for after prom parties at the school. Debra initiated the help of her sisters, Sandra Tillett and Tracey Tillett Manzone, to present the idea to the town and the high school. A committee was formed with former principal, Jean Cote, as Chairperson. John Medeiros later joined to help coordinate construction of the park.

Twenty eight alumni and friends joined together to underwrite the project which was dedicated on December 4, 2003. While planning for their 45th reunion in 2006, the Class of 1961 presented the Brick Park Committee a plan to landscape the park. The plan designed by Betsy Medeiros Lebeau, was approved by the committee and the school. A "Five Year Plan" of implementation began. Plantings were purchased, mulch brought in, and the classmates went to work. Those that could not participate were supportive with donations and encouragement. The Class of 1961 this encourages other graduating classes to get involved in projects such as this.

Today

The park is currently administered by the FHS Brick Park Committee with Tara Kohler, principal at FHS, as chairperson. Funds raised through the sale of bricks are funneled back to the students in the way of scholarships and/or school programs or projects. At least two scholarships have been awarded per year for the last five years. There are a variety of options available to honor former teachers, graduates and loved ones who graduated from the school. Possibilities range from an engraved 4" X 8" paver for \$100 to a 48" X 18" engraved granite bench for \$3000. Bricks are bought for many reasons including retirements, birthdays, and graduations. Many request specific placement in the park such as arranged by family or graduating class.
